The Richmond Terminal Station Project Team is pleased to report that there has been significant progress with the project and the site is starting to be transformed.

Change of company name

Since we were last in touch, our name has changed to AusNet Services. This followed changes in our ownership in August, 2014. AusNet Services remains Victoria's largest energy networks business.

Project update

Completion of the 22kV building

The 22kV building is now complete, including the new façade, which can be seen from Allan Bain Reserve on the southern side. Compact electrical equipment is already installed in the building – this replaces existing outdoor infrastructure which will start to be demolished early in 2015, leading to a reduction in visual clutter on site.



Construction of the 66kV building

Construction of the 66kV building has commenced and will continue during 2015. This building will be situated near the eastern boundary of Allan Bain Reserve and will be built in two stages. Its façade will also be treated once construction is completed, similar to the 22kV building.



Community initiatives

We have been excited to install safety fencing around the school crossing on Mary Street and to provide a new Ball Net in Allan Bain Reserve. These initiatives are part of our commitment to ensuring the safety of students, teachers and parents at Richmond Primary School, and the local community during project construction



Off street car parking for our workers

During the project planning stage, locals informed us of the shortage of parking on local streets. We did not want to exacerbate this problem and therefore AusNet Services has leased land nearby from Yarra Council for use as a car park for our construction crew – this is now fully operational and will be in place for the duration of the project.
